



Pacific Islands Ministry 2019

Hello everyone. Thank you all for your prayers and support. It has been a very busy year. Your generosity has helped us with travel and ministry expense to literally the ends of the earth. From the East Coast of Africa, to the small island nations in the South Pacific. Here's a brief overview of what we did this year.

Foursquare Disaster Relief - March

Mozambique was hit with a cyclone March 21st. Thousands of people (the poorest of the poor) were impacted. Twenty-one Foursquare churches were destroyed by the cyclone. Foursquare Disaster Relief (FDR) responded by sending to Mozambique the first FDR Medical team. Creating a Medical branch of FDR has been a dream of Cindy's for a long time. Cindy has worked hard together with a dedicated team of medical professionals to prepare FDR to send emergency medical responses to countries in need. Because Foursquare has many connections in Mozambique, we were able to go in and work with a letter of Invitation from the Ministry of Health. Our Foursquare family on the ground were able to provide transportation, lodging, food and security. Working alongside a local clinic and the local Foursquare Church we were able to treat 300+ patients resulting in 100+ salvations. We prayed for every patient and many were healed, including Cindy's 'Planters Fasciitis'. This was our first deployment for this brand-new medical branch of Foursquare Disaster Relief. It has been exciting to see the vision of an FDR medical team being fulfilled.



DLT Training Nauru - June



We visited Pastor Frank Miki in Nauru in June. Pastor Frank is a missionary sent from Papua New Guinea. The work in Nauru is a new church plant, consisting of a few families meeting in an open-air church converted car port. Pastor Frank is beginning with leadership development of some key leaders. Cindy and I conducted discipleship and leadership training along with children's ministry and a marriage seminar. A major breakthrough for Frank, was the transformation of his leadership style and the leaders feeling they were a part of a ministry team. We were able to identify with Frank, two unreached people groups that are ready for the gospel. We were also able to share the gospel with a Chinese worker through Google-Translate and show her the Jesus Film in Chinese. We are thanking the Lord for

opportunities of unplanned divine appointments. The majority of businesses in Nauru, are owned by the Chinese. Nauru is also a home for refugees who have no place to go, as a result the Australian Government is paying for the 6,000+ refugees to live there. Many of them are Muslims waiting for visas. The harvest is great with these two people groups, who have no real home. Pray for wisdom in how to reach this mission field!

Cindy and I then flew from Nauru to New Zealand to attend the South Pacific Women Empowered planning/training, conducted by Julie Stott. Cindy had a wonderful time meeting together with the women's ministry leaders throughout the South Pacific and came back with many tools to help her in Women's Ministry.

Solomon Islands - September

Cindy flew to the Solomon Islands and ministered with a team from Australia led by Dave and Luell Parr, and two awesome team members from their church, Megan Kuchel and Katie Syddall. The focus of the team was Women's and Children's ministry. The team did an outreach to a nearby settlement, inviting the women and children to the Women's Retreat. The team ministered in worship, testimonies, and prayer for individuals during the outreach. This resulted in 5 women and 20+ children from the village coming to the retreat.

"All the church kids came with us to do an outreach to a very poor village. The people were visibly touched by the love of Jesus. We were respectful not to take pictures of their houses, as they are so shameful about their circumstances. Most of the infants were completely naked & had sores on their bodies" - Luell Parr.



There were approximately 55 women in attendance for the morning, afternoon, and evening sessions. Gift packs and lunch was provided (chicken, rice, drinks and dessert). The ministry emphasis; Women Created for Purpose - with breakout sessions on grieving and health issues.

"We saw the women's countenance change as their hearts were touched. They realized they were valued by God and that they can MAKE A DIFFERENCE in their circumstances." - Cindy

The team held a VBS on Friday, Ages 4 to 15 years. The goal was to reach the children and mentor the children's leaders from the church. Approximately, 70 children dedicated their lives to Christ! The team also conducted a children's ministry, simultaneously during the

women's retreat. Crafts, games, stories, worship, music lessons, and lunch - provided for all. The Children WILL turn the Solomon Islands upside down for Jesus!

Kenya - September

While Cindy went to the Solomon Islands, Keith went to Kenya with a team of 14 from Life Center Foursquare Church, in Spokane. Five of the team members spoke at a three-day Discipleship Leadership Training (DLT) seminar, sponsored by Spring of Hope International. More than 150 Pastors and Leaders from the community were trained. We also spent two weeks ministering to schools and dedicating clean water development programs in schools and community centers. It is amazing working together with Kenyans, to impact their communities through these projects to further the spread of the gospel!



Palau - October



After ministering in the Solomon Islands Cindy flew to Palau and met Keith, David, and Luella Parr, to help Pastor William and Kristina Yakumbu, with their DLT training. Pastor William is a missionary from PNG and has planted many churches throughout the South Pacific. David and Luella were instrumental in encouraging and training this new work to take on the task of discipling each other. We also did evangelistic outreaches to six elementary schools with over 500 students receiving Christ as their Savior.

"Sharing the gospel in 6 schools in three days! Hundreds accepted Christ! Also, I spent valuable time in training nursing supervisors and one Pediatrician in Helping Babies Breathe. I also shared the gospel and prayed with the staff. We are so appreciative of Pastor Williams and Kristina's hospitality. We feel privileged to be able to be your hands and feet in Palau" - Cindy

Marshall Islands - October

We then traveled to the Marshall Islands to visit Pastor Stephen and Mekelen Saupingi and conducted our DLT training. Pastor Stephen is a missionary from PNG and was one of the first PNG missionaries to plant a church in the South Pacific. The church in the Marshall Islands is a small church plant. We trained over 12 leaders. Subjects included Discipleship, Outreach, Children's ministry, and Marriage. We also did an evangelistic outreach to a local international elementary school with many students receiving Christ as Savior. We were invited to one college to lecture concerning substance abuse and depression. After the lecture, we received a call to come to the other University to do the same. They were impacted greatly. Of course, we were able to share the gospel and pray for the students and the staff! It is so powerful to see God workout these opportunities!

"We are having positive feedback from schools. I met one of the principals and he said after we left, that the students have testimonies of God's presence" - Pastor Stephen



Cindy also conducted a Helping Babies Breathe training, for nurses at the local hospital. She was able to pray with the staff and share with them the gospel message, and that they are God's instruments in their workplace! They showered her with local gifts after the class.

We also had the privilege to baptize 6 teenagers that Pastors Stephen and Mekelen had discipled from childhood in their Sunday School Program.


As you know, encouragement can go a long way. We have had the privilege to come alongside these heroes of the faith and lift up their arms in the midst
